

I Thomas Metcalfe of Marset yeoman ... I appoint my wife Mary Metcalfe and my friends John Binks yeoman and George Scarr Blacksmith both of Hawes executrix and executors I give all my personal estate .. to pay my debts and bring up my son and daughter Thomas and Mary Metcalfe ..... I give my daughter Mary Metcalfe fifty pounds at 21 .. and the further sum of thirty pounds at the decease of my wife ... I give my son Thomas my watch, my clock, my Gun, my large Oak Oval table, the corner cupboard and one oak Box with a carved front not marked with letters. All the remainder into three equal parts ... And I give my wife the use of the house wherein my sister Ann Henderson now lives .. (from the time my son Thomas having attained 21) and the annuity of two pounds ... and if both son and daughter die without issue... then to the children of my late brother James Metcalfe my brother John Metcalfe and my brother Alexander Metcalfe divided equally amongst them .. and twenty pounds a year to my sister Ann Henderson ...
