

I Jeffery Hebden of Marside, yeoman I give my wife Thomasin forty pounds and feather bed and bolsters and bed cloths suitable thereto, and one oak chest and one chest of drawers and a warming pan, and I give the children of my nephew Francis Hebden deceased the sum of fifty pounds divided equally amongst them.. I give my nephew Jeffery Hebden twenty pounds and my best bedstocks and one brass milk Kettle and one field called the Faw with a barn thereon adjoining upon the south side of Marside Rigg and two other closes called the high & Low Pry .. and part of an Allotment on Greenside ... I give all the rest to my nephew Arthur Hebden ... subject to ten pounds a year to my wife Thomasin during her life ... 22nd June 1809. Jeffery Hebden
