- ..to son Richard my lands tenements etc near Raygill House being on the east side of the rivulet commonly called Raygill, subject to a mortgage for the sum of seven hundred pounds together with a right of way from Countersett Lane through and over the closes called ? Hill
- ..charge the same with legacy of three hundred pounds to son John, three hundred pounds to son Thomas and two hundred to son Septimus
- ..to sons William and George all that my messuage etc at Raygill House and all lands on west side of Raygill charged with thirty pounds a year to daughter Dorothy Dawes
- ..to son William, my close in township of Bainbridge called Harry Parrock, then to grandson James Dawes. Same to son Richard Dawes
- ..household furniture, farming stock etc to sons William and George 10 Nov 1832 codicil gave furniture to Dorothy
