yeoman

..to son Richard my lands tenements etc near Raygill House being on the east side of the rivulet commonly called Raygill, subject to a mortgage for the sum of seven hundred pounds together with a right of way from Countersett Lane through and over the closes called ? Hill

..charge the same with legacy of three hundred pounds to son John, three hundred pounds to son Thomas and two hundred to son Septimus

..to sons William and George all that my messuage etc at Raygill House and all lands on west side of Raygill charged with thirty pounds a year to daughter Dorothy Dawes

..to son William, my close in township of Bainbridge called Harry Parrock, then to grandson James Dawes. Same to son Richard Dawes

..household furniture, farming stock etc to sons William and George
