In the name of God Amen the seavententh day of November One thousand six hundred fifty one I Robert Webster of Marsett in the County of Yorke yeoman sicke in body but of good and perfict remembrance thanks be to god doe make constitute and ordaine this my last will and testament in manner and forme followinge first and principally I give and bequeath my soule into the hands of Almighty God my Creator and preserver hopinge and seedfastly believing through ve lerits death and passion of Jesus Christ to have forgiveness of all my sins and my body to be buried in the Church of Chappell yard of Askrigg in hope of a resurrection unto eternall life. And as for my wordly etstae where with it hath pleased God to [indue] my with all I dispose thereof as followeth. First & principally I give and bequeath unto John Beard of Marsett and his wife Elizabeth Beard all my goods and Chattles cattles debts writings or Ingagments forever moveable or unmoveable to be disposed of as followeth. Item I give and bequeath unto my eldest brothers sonn John Webster six shillings eight pence. Item I give unto Richard Webster six shillings eight pence Item to Alis Webster of Bainbridge six shillings eight pence. Item to John Webster my brothers sonn six pounds to be paid when he doth come to twenty one yeares of age. Item to [Henrey] Webster brother to the said John Webster eight pounds to be paid when he cometh to twenty one yeares of age. Item to James Webster his brother six pounds to be paid at the same tearme of twenty one yeares of age. All which legacies to be disposed out of my said goods whatsoever by them the said John Beard and his wife Elizabeth whome I ordaine my full executors. And that they betwixt them pay and discharge my funerall expences In witnes whereof I have sett to my hand and seale the day and yeare above said, Robert Webster his marke, sealed with this Memorandum that these thre legacies six shillings eight pence is not to be paid tell the day of St Andrew next after the date hereof. Thomas Thompson, Thomas Lambert marke Rich Robinson
